- The Signs of Suicide Program was introduced to 8th Grade Students in the Fall of 2018.
 - **A**cknowledge
 - **C**are
 - **T**ell
- Students completed the BSAD measure
 - Students indicating current suicidal ideation/attempt met with a school counselor, school worker, or school psychologist on the day of the screening
 - Students indicating other concerns were with throughout the week

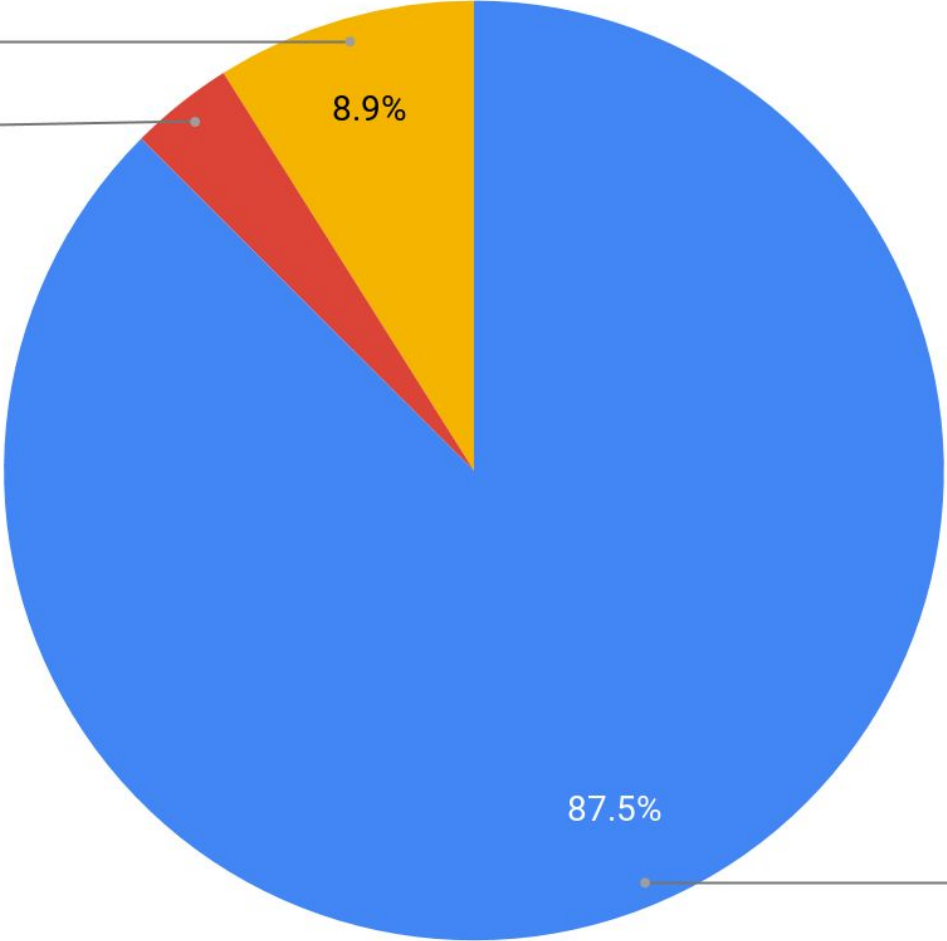
SOS Screening Results
